OUTSIDE PLAY AND WEATHER

Playing outside is very important to developing overall health and well-being for children. They need time to connect with nature, run and embrace all of their wonderful energy with abandon. When given regular opportunity to be physically active they are better able to self-regulate their bodies and their minds. During rain, sunshine and possibly even snow we will be going outside for recess, lunch recess and likely other times during the day. Please make sure your child comes prepared to be outside with proper outdoor gear. We are going to have fun!

VERIFICATION FORMS AND ALLERGY ALERT

The verification forms sent home today are extremely important. They provide information that helps us to ensure your child is safe at school. Please make sure you check that your phone numbers, email addresses and EMERGENCY contact information is correct and up-to-date. Indicating if your child has learning needs and requires support services is also very important.

It is essential that we know if your child has any allergies. If your child does have a life-threatening allergy further information will be required and forms will be sent to you to be completed. School District 62 has an Anaphylaxis policy to ensure the safety of our students. In order to keep all children safe, our schools are considered "peanut aware". Letters will be sent home to ensure that parents are aware of the nature of the allergies in your child's class and what processes are required. Thank you for your support!



Traffic can sometimes be a challenge at dismissal time. The community has worked diligently to create a plan that will keep everyone safe and keep the traffic moving smoothly. Thank you so much for your patience and good humour during the first week of school as we worked through the challenges. Here are some key points to remember.

- 1. Speed limits are posted at the bottom of Silverstone.
- 2. Please refrain from making U-Turns on Nugget Terrace. Please use the natural turnaround at the END of Nugget.
- 3. Staff are on crosswalk/bus duty from 2:36 until 3:00.
- 4. Please do not leave your car unattended and parked in traffic circle. Be ready and waiting for your child so the many buses do not get blocked.
- 5. Please pull up as far as possible during pick-up and drop-off to let your child enter and exit your car.
- 6. We have a limited number of parking spots available but Mill Hill also has spots just down the road.
